- Doing nothing

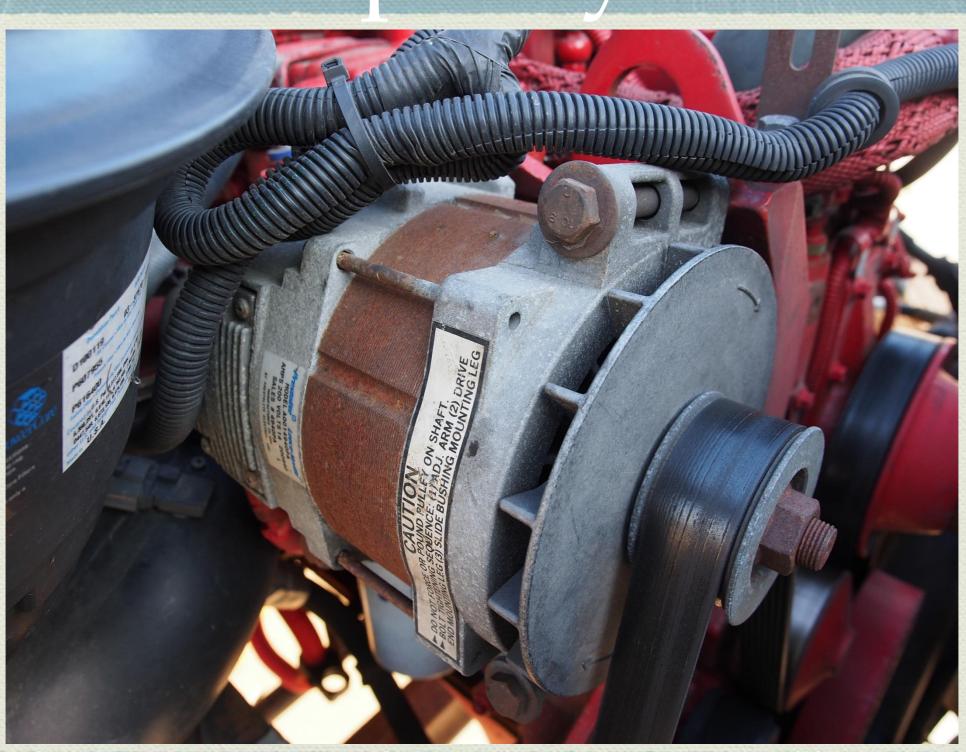


Overreacting/Power struggles in traffic or with passengers in our care

Common Language/Paradigms

Common Language/Paradigms

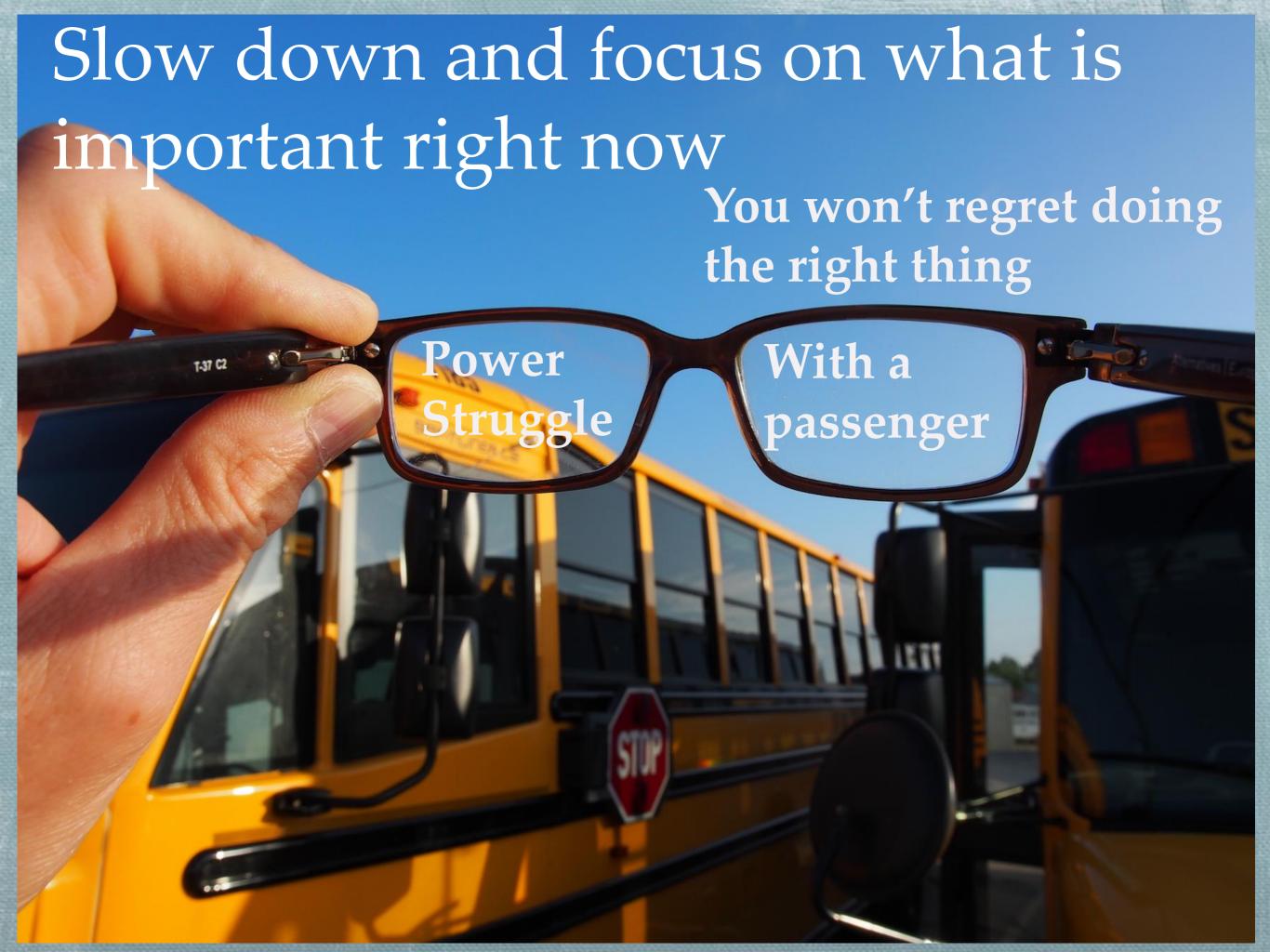
Steer where you want to go: Take a breath/pause and consider where you want to go with an encounter. Look toward *going home* and not into a power struggle with someone in your care or someone in traffic.

Most mistakes leading to a very bad day with passengers or in traffic on a bus have very little to do with a lack of skill and most of these mistakes are made when the bus isn't moving. Normally it is simply cutting corners.

Best Passenger Service Advice

Be consistent.

Know your passengers well.

It's all about relationships—Good relationships become your "hidden team" and can help overcome a bad day.
